Old Business: None



Helmet Update

Bicycle Helmet Safety Institute The Helmet Update Vol. 34, #4 -- June 2

Summary: The August issue of Consumer Reports updates its 2015 bicycle helmet report, adding new models and testing two MIPS models compared to non-MIPS versions. They found that MIPS reduced rotational force up to 43 percent, but drew no conclusions about what that might mean for injury. They gave Excellent impact protection ratings to 24 models, with the remaining 10 scoring Very Good. They check-rated 18 mod-

els. Of those they picked seven Best Buys, none of them MIPS models. No helmets tested were rated Do Not Buy.

Scores

The highest overall ratings went to the Scott Arx Plus, Cannondale Quick, Bell Gage MIPS, Bell Draft, Bontrager Solstice Youth, Bell Draft MIPS, Bontrager Circuit, Cannondale Teramo, and Smith forefront. The Bell Draft scored higher than its MIPS twin due to better ventilation.

Impact protection ratings

The impact ratings have been CU's biggest contribution to consumer information, and our key criterion for helmet choice. After testing 34 models in the lab, CU rated 24 of them Excellent, and the remaining 11 as Very Good.

Fit

Fit is our second key criterion, and here CU was more discriminating. They rated Excellent the Scott Arx Plus, Bell Gage MIPS, Smith Forefront, Kali City Helmet, and Bontrager Solstice Youth. Rated Poor were the Overade Plixi folder, Razor V-17 Youth, Bell Disney Frozen Tiara, Wipeout Dry Erase and Raskullz Mohawk.

Ventilation

Only the Cannondale Quick, Bell Draft, Specialized Chamonix and Specialized Chamonix MIPS rated Excellent for ventilation. The Smith Forefront, with a liner partially made of hollow Koroyd[tm] straws, was rated only Good. Eleven models rated Poor.

Concussion?

CU discussed recent concussion concerns. They had tested MIPS vs Non-MIPS models and found that MIPS reduced rotational force by 43 percent. We do not know what testing protocols they used. They concluded that "The MIPS helmets in our ratings are priced \$20 to \$25 more than the non-MIPS versions. Even if the extra benefit isn't definitive, a MIPS helmet might be worth the extra cost."

What We Missed

This is CU's best recent helmet article and certainly worth a look if you are researching a new helmet, although the number of helmets included is still small. Most of the models are available only in bike stores, leaving out the millions of helmets sold in discount stores.

This five-year project will create and implement a number of plans on various topics, one of which will be transportation. In the next couple of months there will be a number of Community Conversations about this project.

November General Election: Bike Issues

Bicycle Coordinator for the Tri-County Region

Accommodating Bicyclists on the Proposed Bus Rapid Transit Route (BRT)

TCBA members Tim Potter, Lenny Provencher and Rory Neuner attended a meeting about various aspects of the BRT. It was organized by State Representative Sam Singh. There was discussion about the latest version of CATA's plans. The most constructive point was having a regional meeting about improving East-West options for bicycling around the area (and presumably not just along Michigan/Grand River Avenue corridor).

The TCBA Advocacy Committee (<http://advocacy.biketcba.org/>) meets the second Wednesday of each month at Conference Room A of the Neighborhood Empowerment Center (600 W. Maple St., Lansing) from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. Everyone is welcome to attend.

May Advocacy Committee Report

May was National Bike Month and it saw a lot of activity on several fronts.

The Ride of Silence (May 18) had over 200 riders and had good media coverage. See the report in this issue.

On May 18 Stephen Clark, Bicycle Friendly Community Specialist of the League of American Bicyclists, toured Lansing's downtown and East Side with a number of interested people (including several Advocacy Committee members). He made several suggestions and observations about the local cycling infrastructure.

MSU hosted a Bike Friendly America Conference that was attended by about fifty people from Michigan and the Midwest. Several out of town attendees were impressed with our progress, especially in the attendance for the Ride of Silence.

May 20's Greater Lansing Bike Movie Night had a turnout of 100+ bike cinema enthusiasts who were treated to twenty-five imaginative short films. REO Town's Robin Theater was a great venue and Dean Brailey's cheesecakes proved to be a popular fund raising device.

On the Ingham County Trails front, the County has brought up a web site: <http://pk.ingham.org/InghamCountyTrailsandParksMillage.aspx>. Applications for various maintenance and new-build projects are being submitted. On May 26 Nancy Krupiarz, Steve Leiby and Mike Unsworth attended a stakeholders' meeting about forming a Trail Ambassadors program. Julie Clark of Traverse Area Recreation and Transport

ation Trails (<http://traversetrails.org/>) gave a detailed and interesting presentation about their Ambassadors. The remainder of the meeting was devoted to a "Road Café Exercise" entitled "Putting the Ingham Program Together" in which participants wrote their thoughts on Identifying & Prioritizing Volunteer Tasks, Volunteer Recruitment, and Operational Logistics & Concerns. Future meetings will flesh out a program.

Seeing that that this is an election year, Mike Unsworth will be canvassing TCBA members via Facebook & the discussion list about what bike-related questions members should ask candidates.

At our monthly meeting, we discussed the recent crash statistics that revealed an alarming upward trend in across almost all transportation categories. 2015 was at a 50-year high. Drugged driving is also up. Finally, there is a 57% increase in bicyclist fatalities and the crash severity is up. Preliminary speculation is that distracted driving and driving under the influence may be the culprits. Further analysis is being done on the state and national levels.
