President's Update

As you all have read TCBA has a budget deficit. This deficit is due to declining revenue from DALMAC which is TCBA's primary source of income. That said, for the past few years TCBA has spent funds more to support membership, promote safe, social bicycling and create community partnerships than we have received from DALMAC. The TCBA Board has asked for, and received input from members, on how we could proceed to make some budget cuts to reduce this deficit. We have decided to make some changes that minimally will impact us all.

- -TCBA will stop printing and mailing the "Chainwheel Chatter" effective January 2018. (The Board is considering how to identify the handful of TCBA members who do not have Internet access and, therefore, might be unable to access a digital copy of the Chainwheel Chatter.) We will continue to produce the "Chainwheel Chatter", and this will be available online for your easy access.
- -TCBA will eliminate our telephone service.
- -TCBA is also making several reductions in our Board spending. These cuts may reduce some aspects of "services" provided to our members but Events will continue like the Picnic, Holiday Party and Appreciation Dinner.
- -TCBA Board has worked very hard over the last several months to make these decisions, so that our mission of "Promoting safe, social bicycling since 1972" may continue another 48+ years. We believe making these small changes now, will allow TCBA to continue as a leader in this area, in Michigan, and in the United States.

June 2018 Advocacy Committee Report by Mike Unsworth

Discussion with Andy Kilpatrick, Public Service Director for the City of Lansing

At the June meeting we had a wide-ranging talk on future projects in Lansing. The City's Non-Motorized Transportation plan should be unveiled this Fall. Andy also discussed the funding gap for street repairs: \$20 million per year is estimated to bring the City's roads up to fair condition. It looks like only \$11 million per year will be available.

He hopes to implement a sign standard that will identify bike routes. It will conform to the proposed Ingham County Trails signage. City planners are favorably looking at future (re) conversion of one-way to two-way streets. As for Downtown bike lockers, some will be for state employees (due to security concerns) while others will be for the public. The City hopes to activate them in the fall.

Bike Safety Billboard Project

Two ten-by-twenty-two feet billboards are scheduled to be put up during the week of July 2. They will be the printed "poster" variety and will be up for about a month. Adams Outdoor Advertising will assign the location. This is the trade-off we made for an affordable rate. Once up, there will be maximum club publicity

We'd like to have public events, maybe flash mobs, if the locations are suitable. Many thanks to Phil Wells and Ann Siegel for their hard work on this project.

Coleman Road Extension

On June 13, it was announced that Coleman Road in East Lansing will be extended westward to use an underpass that was built for an abandoned rail line. The Advocacy Committee will work with the authorities to ensure that East Lansing's existing bike lanes will be put onto this extension.

Bicycle Helmet Safety Institute The Helmet Update - Vol. 36, #6 -- June 26, 2018

Virginia Tech's Biomedical Engineering and Mechanics lab has released a new STAR system for rating bicycle helmets, with 30 models rated. The ratings varied considerably, with four 5-star models and two that got only 2 stars.

The helmets were already certified to the CPSC standard using severe impacts, so the ratings are based on testing that explores their ability to perform in lower-level impacts, and their ability to handle rotational forces that are widely believed to be important in causing concussions. The full methodology is explained on the Virginia Tech site: https://www.beam.vt.edu/helmet/bicycle-helmet-ratings.html

The four 5-star models (all of them MIPS-equipped) were: Bontrager Ballista MIPS, Louis Garneau Raid MIPS, Bell Stratus MIPS, and Specialized Chamonix MIPS.

The results give MIPS a boost after Snell's recent announcement that their own testing showed no benefit for the technology. But Tech used the type of setup favored by MIPS for rotational testing, with a very rough slanted anvil and a headform with a polyurethane skin. And one of the MIPS helmets tested scored only three stars.

Note that Tech tests only models submitted to them by manufacturers, so the models were carefully selected. No manufacturer submitted an identical MIPS and non-MIPS model.

We welcome this new approach to bicycle helmet testing and believe that ratings systems will be more useful to consumers as other standards remain stagnant in the face of new concerns about concussion-level impacts.

Counterfeit Helmet Seller Convicted

Back in 2014 a Kentucky man bought counterfeit Specialized S-Works Prevail, Giro Aeon, and Catlike Whisper helmets from Ali Baba and sold them on Ebay for prices well below retail.

The helmets were tested and did not meet the CPSC standard. They lacked internal reinforcing and broke apart in normal testing.

The seller has now been convicted of mail fraud and trafficking in counterfeit goods. Details on how Specialized blew the whistle and the US government responded in 2014 are in this Bicycle Retailer and Industry News article:
