

NorthWest Tour 2019

Experience sand dunes and sandy beaches, small lakes and Great Lakes, orchards and vineyards, and the northwest Michigan charm of resort towns like Empire, Glen Arbor, Suttons Bay, and Traverse City.

NorthWest Tour is a five day bicycle tour in the beautiful Sleeping Bear Dunes and Leelanau areas of Michigan's northwest Lower Peninsula. The tour features great scenery on good roads through many small towns and tourist areas, all from the convenience of a single camping location. Indigo Bluffs Resort, 3.5 miles east of Empire, will be our host for the tour.

The tour begins on Wednesday, June 12 and ends on Sunday, June 16. There is camping

available starting on Wednesday after 12:00 Noon. On Sunday riders must return to the campground in time to pack and leave by 3:00pm.

Daily routes typically have shorter and longer options of about 30, 60, and 100 miles. The first and last days are of the shorter variety to allow for travel time. **Be prepared for hilly terrain** no matter which routes you take.

This is primarily a tent camping tour. Our campsites are in a wooded area, with nice restrooms and showers. Anyone not tenting must reserve their site directly with Indigo Bluffs RV Park, at 231-326-5566.

Included in the basic **fee of \$190** are tent camping facilities, route maps, SAG service, and meals. Breakfast and dinner Thursday through Saturday and breakfast on Sunday are provided and served under a large canopy in the camping area. And now, added last year, a cookie stop or two on the route!

There are also group campfires with S'mores and munchies on some evenings, a concert featuring great local talent, and a pretty awesome raffle!

Registration is online only and starts on Sunday, January 20 at 7pm. The first 300 entries will be accepted. We recommend that you apply promptly as the Tour fills quickly! The registration link and the Tour guidebook can be found on our webpage at:

Bicycle Helmet Safety Institute The Helmet Update - Vol. 36, #8 -- December 14, 2018

Virginia Tech publishes more helmet ratings

Virginia Tech has published more STAR system helmet ratings, bringing the total up to 50. Six of the additions earned 5 Stars and another 9 were 4 Star, the range that Tech recommends. Of those, one was also rated tops for impact protection by Consumer Reports, the Schwinn Intercept. It retails for \$18.

Most of the top performers in the Virginia Tech testing were MIPS models, reflecting in part their use of the same methodology that MIPS uses: sticky headform, tight strap, severe anvil angle, rough grippy anvil, no neck. That methodology couples the headform more tightly to the helmet than it would be in the real world. It would be expected to favor the MIPS models, unlike the Snell Foundation's research that showed no benefit from MIPS.

There is still no consensus that the Virginia Tech formula for rating helmets for concussion pinpoints the helmets that reduce concussion the best. Changes to the tested helmets to improve their scores might not result in fewer concussions in the field. But since established standards organizations have failed to respond to concussion concerns, these ratings represent a good start at testing helmets systematically for lower-level and rotational impact performance.

Bikes: Science on Two Wheels

More than 40 bicycle, historic and modern, form the centerpiece of "Bikes: Science on Two Wheels" at the Kalamazoo Valley Museum September 22—January 6.

The bicycle, or some version of it, has been around since the nineteenth century, and it is still a popular form of transportation today. Bikes are a part of our everyday life from childhood through adulthood, but we don't often notice the science behind this wonderful invention. In the exhibit BIKES: Science on Two Wheels, we get to see over 40 variations of bikes from the late 1800's to modern times, including the classics and oddities. Through a dozen interactives, visitors are able to engage in the science, history, design, and art behind the bicycle!

On display are four sections that take us on a tour and show us the cultural impact the bicycle has had on our world!

The Origins: Features the evolution of, and the precursors to, the modern bicycle.

The Classics: Showcases bicycles from the 1930's to the late 1970's.

The Sport Bikes: Focuses on multi-speed bikes and the change in technology.

Oddities and Offshoots: Displays examples of "not so ordinary" bikes.

This exhibit is organized by the Carnegie Science Center in cooperation with the Bicycle Museum of America.

November 2018 Advocacy Committee Report By Mike Unsworth

Discussion with Bill Conklin, Director, Ingham County Road Department, at our November 14 meeting

The Committee has been fortunate that Mr. Conklin has annually visited and brought us up to date on Department's activities. By outlining the complex structure of road funding in Michigan, he demonstrated it is difficult for road agencies and construction firms to do rational, long-term planning.

The 2015 road funding increase was intended to restore State's roads to "fair condition." If the 2015 package hadn't passed, then road agencies would have only enough resources for maintenance of the status quo.

Bill explained a preliminary map of 2019 projects his Department hopes to do. One area of concern is the rebuilding of downtown Okemos (the intersection of Okemos and Hamilton Roads) may not have enough room for bike lanes.

When asked about how citizens and groups like TCBA can correct the funding uncertainty, he said we should urge our legislators to construct a solid, long-term plan of funding.

2019 Preliminary Advocacy Budget

We reviewed the categories and were satisfied with it

Ingham County Trails Millage

Ten jurisdictions submitted thirteen projects for 2018 round; totaling \$8.8 million. Millage will produce for 2018 about \$3.5 million. Ingham County Parks Committee will rank projects on December 10 and send to County

Commission which will review in January 2019. For more information on specific applications see pp. 5-50 of http://pk.ingham.org/Portals/PK/Packets/2018/NOV-13-COMM-CMPLT-PKT.pdf)

A special meeting of trail stakeholders on wayfinding signs for trails system was held on November 1. Prior to meeting, the County Commissioners disagreed with the consultant's estimate of \$1.4 million to sign the system. Participants discussed options for having a more affordable proposal.

Next Steps for Advocacy Committee

This topic will be the only item for January 9, 2019 meeting. Mike Unsworth will continue as Chairman until February 1, 2019.

Advocacy Tasks By Mike Unsworth

TCBA Advocacy Committee Activities by Michael Unsworth

The Advocacy Committee needs a new division of labor. The goal is to spread the work around so the new chairperson doesn't get overwhelmed with work.

The first part of this article is the Advocacy Committee's Mission Statement followed the work the Committee has done in the past several years.

Mission Statement (from the Advocacy web page)

- Develop a safer bicycling environment
- Promote public awareness of bicycle safety issues and concerns
- Promote bicycle commuting and touring
- Educate governments, organizations and companies on strategies to encourage safe bicycle travel
- Work with other organizations to carry out this mission and activities relating to non-motorized transportation

Tasks and Time Commitments (Covered by the Officers and Committee Members)

- 1. Time estimates are for the month
- Times for non-Advocacy meetings includes travel time

- Holding monthly strategy meetings
 - Chair:
 - Gathering & posting agendas—Thirty minutes
 - Running meetings—Two hours (includes opening and closing the LMB offices)
 - Monitoring the progress of various initiatives—Two to four hours; depends on how many initiatives
 - Insuring that the chair or other members represent TCBA at meetings.
 - **Secretary**: Taking initial notes of meetings, circulating drafts, and finalizing minutes. Posting final minutes of meetings to the Advocacy web sites— Two to four hours
- Maintaining and posting activities to the discussion list, the Advocacy web site and social media--Three to five hours
- Attending and participating at public meetings, especially those devising Non-Motorized Plans—two hours per meeting
- Developing an annual budget for the Committee—done during the September and October meetings (1 hour)
- Contacting public officials (in-person and written):
 - Inviting them to Advocacy meetings—Thirty minutes
 - Having a TCBA presence at critical public meetings and events, such as the Ingham County Parks Commission about trail millage spending—Two hours per meeting
 - Discussing specific projects such as the Business I-69 "Superstreets" Project and poor design of construction projects concerning bike/pedestrian access--Varies
 - One-on-one discussions--Varies
- Hosting Bike Film Nights—Five to seven hours over a couple of months
- Doing outreach to other bicycling organizations & groups and the public (speakers bureau talks, bike rodeos, Quiet Waters Symposium, etc.) --Varies
- Organizing and conducting Ride(s) of Silence:
 - May ride--Twenty hours over a period of three to four months. Done by a committee
 - Other rides—Five to ten hours
- Informing the TCBA Board (reporting at their meeting) and club members of Advocacy activities (monthly and annual reports in *Chainwheel*; TCBA social media postings—Five hours
- Surveying political candidates on their views on bicycling issues—Ten to fifteen hours over two months
- Conducting Bike Repair Sessions at the City Rescue Mission—Two hours for mechanics; one hour for organizer
- Conducting specific Bike Safety Activities, e.g., the Safe Passing Distance Billboards—depends on the project

Changes to TCBA Membership Dues

The TCBA Board of Directors has voted to increase membership dues effective January 1, 2019. The increases are modest, as shown below. For a one-year membership, individuals will pay \$5 more per year, and families will pay \$7 more per year. For a four-year membership, individuals will pay only \$4 more, and families will pay only \$8 more. If you renew for four years, the per year cost for an individual is only \$9 per year; for a family, it is only \$12 per year. With the new rates, family dues are always 33% higher than individual dues, regardless of the number of years selected. In addition, for both individuals and families, the greater the number of years you pay for, the lower the per-year price you pay.
